Facing Rapid Change

When our older daughter started university in the United States, majoring in mass communications, her professor told her class, “By the time you graduate, everything you learn now will be obsolete.” That was not very encouraging for a first-year undergrad! At a conference for educators, the speaker flashed on the screen a list of jobs that had existed five years before, but at that time no longer existed. Again, that begs the question of how prepared we are for the future.

Will we be left behind by the fast pace of change? The generation of our parents or grandparents probably saw one or two major changes in their lifetime. My parents lived through the time when black-and-white TV changed their lives. Today we are likely to witness a major change every few years! How do we face the challenges of such rapid change?

We need to learn to discern between what stays and what passes. Often, changes occur on the surface and don’t last. But they reveal needs underneath that will always be there. For a time, fads like Hello Kitty, Gangnam Style, and Pokemon attracted millions, but they came and went. We all want to be part of the crowd, to be “in”—but the need to belong must find something more durable.

What is durable? “...the grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of the Lord endures forever” (1 Peter 1:24-25 NIV). **Amidst change, we all long to be part of something bigger, stronger and firmer.** The word of the Lord, which proclaims the gospel, the good news of Jesus, tells a story that encompasses all time and fulfils all longings. Everyone who comes to Jesus finds an anchor that holds for eternity. “We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure” (Hebrews 6:19 NIV).

- 8:50pm onwards: Conversations over finger food

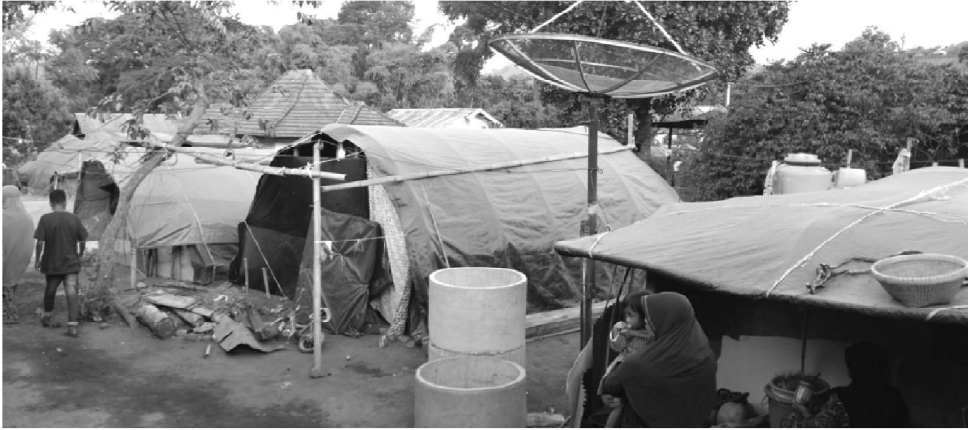

Medical Relief

Reflection on Lombok Medical Relief Trip (12–17 October)

I joined a medical relief mission trip to Lombok in October after hearing about the severe earthquakes there some weeks and months before. The trip was a stretching, eye-opening, encouraging experience.

I felt stretched in several ways. In addition to the fluidity of plans and schedule that's typical of mission trips, I found the daily work of operating a mobile medical clinic physically tiring, and the nature of the work was new to me so I had a lot to learn. Also, it was challenging to learn to work together with many new people within a short time—the team comprised ten people from several different church backgrounds and even different religions, but we had to quickly learn to work together, deal with tensions and disagreements that arose along the way, and forbear and forgive and encourage one another.

I was inspired by the believers I met in Lombok. One local pastor told us how he and his young family narrowly escaped death as they were forced to flee Lombok during a period of fierce persecution some years ago. Yet a few short months later they returned to Lombok and he's been ministering there ever since, because he believes God wants him there.

Other believers shared how their own family members threatened to kill them after they came to Christ, so for many years now, they've been living openly as Christians but estranged from their families. In the presence of these brothers and sisters in Christ, I felt rather small and in awe. Their faith in Christ is tested, lived out, and obviously real. They've suffered significant persecution and loss on account of Him, but in their suffering they stuck with Him and trusted Him to take care of them. After spending a bit of time with them, I realised my own faith is quite small and often theoretical.

This trip also shaped my perspective on mission trips. I learned more about demonstrating Christ's love for people through caring action while strictly refraining from overt evangelism and prayer due to cultural sensitivities. I also learned that, while the medical impact of such trips is actually very small, it's still worthwhile, as it communicates Christ's love and concern to people in need of care and encouragement, and opens doors for future follow-up ministry by local ministers.



I think this trip helped to push me out of myself and make me more aware of the great needs of others. I realised my life is full of stuff, in the sense that I've been given a huge amount of privileges and possessions in life, and also in the sense that my life is full of clutter that endlessly distracts me from more important things. I will need God's help to focus my life and spend it on things that matter.
