Prayer Points

Our Church

Extraordinary Congregational Meeting (Budget Approval) (23 Feb) — Pray for God's guidance in preparations. Pray that we will have clarity on the budget, which has seen months of work and several rounds of feedback. Pray that God will enable us to commit not just financial resources but also our commitment and prayer to the ministry planned for the year ahead.

Session Meeting (18 Feb) — Pray for God's guidance for our pastors and elders especially with regard to care for the church family at this time.

Christianity Explored (19 Feb) — Attendance last week was affected by various reasons including injury and work. Please pray for God to continue working in the lives of those who have attended, and that those who can will return for the remaining sessions.

Our World

Coronavirus Response — Praise God for how Christians have been a light in the sombre situation:

In Wuhan, Christians have borne the risk of persecution and infection to go out on the streets to preach the gospel and give out free face masks. Pray for God to work mightily through their witness.

Here in Singapore, Christians have been part of efforts to care for the homeless and encourage healthcare workers, among others. Pray for many to have eyes to see that all this is done because God gives us His love. Pray for Him to bless ongoing efforts (see p 8).

Pray for Christians and churches to be a witness to God's peace, overcoming fear, distrust, and selfishness, by our actions and words. Pray that we will respond with God's grace to the need for security that is revealed in our own and others' lives. Pray that those who need a "reset" in our spiritual lives will turn to God (see p 7).

Pray for God's mercy on those infected, especially those in critical condition. We also pray for wisdom and protection for our leaders, healthcare workers and civil servants, as well as for all who work in public daily, providing essential services.

Yemen — Aid agencies have reported obstruction, arrests and intimidation. Pray that aid will be freely allowed to get to millions in urgent need.

East Africa — Ethiopia, Somalia and Kenya, as well as other countries, face the threat of devastating locust swarms. This could be the biggest infestation in decades. Pray for God's mercy, that loss of crops and food security may be averted.

What's in a Virus?

I find it strange that 10 years after leaving the world of medical research, I'm once again inundated by articles on virology! Suddenly the whole world has become infectious disease experts—or perhaps you may have come to the hard realisation that there is still a lot we do not know and certainly cannot control.

Why is God doing this?

Like all forms of suffering, our first question when it hits close to home is 'why'. There are usually no direct answers—at least while the suffering is going on. What we can know for sure, as Christians, is that this virus is from the Lord and it is to further His purposes in Christ Jesus. Take for example this verse we went through a few months ago in Amos:

Amos 4:10: "I sent among you a pestilence after the manner of Egypt... yet you did not return to me," declares the LORD.

So let's be clear: God is in control of this epidemic (pandemic?), God knew when and where it would start, how long it will last and how it will spread. If we know this, then how are we to react?

I think our first reaction of fear, anxiety and retreat is understandable, but the more important question is—now we've reacted and had time to think—what is the next step? Will we go towards God, or will we go away from Him? Will we move towards His people (in safe ways please) or will we isolate ourselves further? Will we open our hands to our neighbour, or will we clench our fists and hoard?

For God's people, this is certainly a test of where our hearts lie.

If we find ourselves struggling and scrambling, it's not a failure. The Lord is kind, and so—as He says in Amos—He has open arms for us to return to Him. This may be an opportunity to reset our spiritual lives and find new hope in the gospel. With so many things cancelled, now we have the time to spend reading His Word, re-forming our prayer lives, sharing devotions with our children, meeting 1-to-1 with our AG members, finding a mentor or spiritual counsellor.

As I said in the first sermon of the year: this year, we focus on 'rest'. God has made a way for us, has He not? What will you do with this virus-ridden 2020?
