Questions for Discussion and Reflection:

- 1. Recap what the Preacher has said in this passage. How does it summarize much of what he has been saying so far in Ecclesiastes?
- 2. Why, and on what basis, does he say that life is better than death, and calls us to go and enjoy life?
- 3. Can you accept what the Preacher has said about life, and about being in the hand of God? Talk to God about it.

Prayer Points

Our Church

Covid Cases – We have received increasingly more notification of members testing positive. Pray for God's grace to sustain these and that they may all recover fully. Pray also for the vulnerable in our midst as we return for in-person activities weekly. We continue to encourage members to inform Ps Alby or Bro Zhiwen if you attended a church activity in person and later test positive. We need to ensure that your close contacts are informed and that they avoid interaction with the vulnerable young and elderly in their family. Kindly also refrain from returning for in person activities if you are not feeling well.

Zion Bishan Kindergarten – Several children from ZBK have also contracted the virus. Pray for the staff team as they maintain a safe environment for children who are mainly below vaccination age.

The Next Lap Continues – It's been more than a year since the formation of the 4 English Congregations with their dedicated Shepherding teams. Since last month the 1030am & 1pm CSTs have been working together to support one another, as have the 3pm & 5pm CSTs. Pray for our leaders as they continue to think how best to disciple and care for each member of the Zion Bishan flock.

Soccer Ministry – Since late Feb 2022, the ministry is taking a 3 week break from training due to rising Omicron cases in the community and the usual exam

and term break. Pray that the relationships made through this platform to the youth and children from our neighbourhood will be a good and effective way for us to shine the light of Christ's love and truth into these various families

Youth Fellowship — Pray that our youths will have a clearer vision of Jesus as they study the gospel of Mark, through monthly Bible-talks. Thank God for various families who have been opening up their homes to host dinners with youths. Pray for mutual edification as we engage in intergenerational fellowship.

Our World

India – Pray for the provision of good and appropriate training materials for the many rural pastors under one partner here. Pray also for unity between these rural pastors and other pastors from urban places. Praise God also for the joyous occasion of the inauguration of a new church hall in 2 weeks' time.

Ukraine – Since Russia began an escalated invasion of Ukraine on 24 Feb, it is estimated that more than 2 million people have fled Ukraine, according to United Nations (BBC 8 Mar). Poland has taken in 1.2m refugees, followed by Hungary 190k, Slovakia 141k, Moldova 83k, Romania 82k etc. Pray for the Lord's mercy on the refugees and for the church to respond to provide for the refugees and for Christians to be witnesses for Christ in this time of need.

Please Stay

'Please stay,' the border guard said as we fled Ukraine — This headline on page 8 of The Straits Times, 8 March 2022, caught my attention. It is an account of two foreigners and a Ukrainian who made it to Poland. The words of a Ukrainian soldier checking the writer's passport haunted him as they crossed into Slovakia, "Please stay, but you may go if you want."

I believe the words of the Ukrainian soldier were uttered with emotions. Therein was a sadness to see people leaving the country and a soft plea to the writer and his friends to consider remaining behind in Ukraine. The soldier likely had torn feelings. He understood people are fleeing out of fear. He understood the instinct for survival, especially families with young children and elderly folks. Yet Ukraine needs its people to remain and defend their homes, their families, their country.

What about the soldier? I am sure he has loved ones. Where are they? If they have left, would he ever see them again? Seeing hordes of fellow citizens fleeing the country must be very hard for him. Why doesn't he just abandon his post and flee with his family? He didn't and neither did many others who stood their ground and remained behind, for as long as they are able.

Like the soldier who pleaded, "Please stay", could you ever make sense of what is happening? Is this real? What does the future hold? Where is God? What if this is happening in our very own country? At our doorstep? It's a frightening thought. Our generation has never tasted war in this part of the world.

Where is God? Wasn't this the same question asked by countless around the world at the height of the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020? Wasn't this the cry of Afghan Christians when the country returned to the rule of the Taliban? We can never claim to understand the feelings of Ukrainians or Afghan Christians. But we have directly experienced the Covid-19 global pandemic and at some point, we too have wondered where God is.

So, where is God? He is right here where we are! People may abandon homes and countries in catastrophic crises... but God will never abandon us... **God will stay!**

"fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10

MOVING BOUNDARY STONES

"Do not move an ancient boundary stone set up by your ancestors." Proverbs 22.28

The Law of Moses (Deuteronomy 19.14; 27.17) warns against moving boundary stones which mark where one's territory begins and ends. Once these ancient lines are drawn, they must be respected. Such respect for territorial integrity is fundamental to justice and peace in any society, and for the world.

RUSSIAN INVASION OF LIKRAINE

The recent Russian invasion of Ukraine is clearly a violation of another country's territorial sovereignty. God's Word condemns it: "'Cursed be anyone who moves his neighbor's landmark.' And all the people shall say, 'Amen.'" Deut 27:17 ESV Indeed, a loud "Amen" was sounded at the United Nations when Singapore joined 140 other nations in condemning Russia's action.

RETENTION OF 377A

But the principle of boundary stones goes beyond the physical. Just as lines are drawn on land, showing where we live, boundaries are also marked out in morals, prescribing how we should live. In this regard, we welcome the recent decision of the Court of Appeal in dismissing the latest legal challenge to Section 377A which the Government decided in 2007 to retain in the Penal Code.

Not repealing the limits set on the practice of sexuality respects the moral position of a significant segment of our population. At the same time, not enforcing such limits respects others in our wider society who do not hold to such a moral position. The Government has noted that for a "large majority" in Singapore, "the heterosexual stable family remains the social norm," and that the current legal position reflects "our society's norms, values and attitudes". We stand with and support these observations as reported in the news media.

DIVORCE BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT

One more matter calls for our concern: the boundary stone that governs marriage and divorce. The recent passing of a bill introducing "No-Fault Divorce" or "Divorce by Mutual Agreement" (DMA) aims to reduce acrimony between divorcing spouses

and the fallout on children and other affected parties. It makes divorce "a joint responsibility" with both partners taking the blame.

While it sounds humane, it overlooks the sanctity of marriage as a lifelong commitment, not only to each other but also to God. Jesus affirms what was taught by Moses: "So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate." On divorce, He adds, "Because of your hardness of heart Moses allowed you to divorce your wives, but from the beginning it was not so." Matthew 19:6, 8 ESV

The boundary stone, set "from the beginning" should not be moved. The "joint responsibility" of a challenging marriage should be directed at honouring and safeguarding the union. For the Christian couple whose union is hallowed by God and witnessed by His people, divorce should not be an option. That said, acknowledging our sinful nature ("hardness of heart"), divorce does happen, and as God's people we want to pray and help towards the healing of all who are hurt.

GOING FORWARD

BPCIS has commissioned the Biblical Graduate School of Theology to study the legal and theological aspects of the DMA, and present implications for the church. A seminar will be held on 30 April 2022, 10am, to share their findings. More details later.

As for the crisis in Ukraine, BPCIS is sending \$10,000 from our Relief Fund through Operation Mobilisation which has been working with local communities there since 1994. Please refer to our website for "Prayer for Ukraine" based on Psalm 46, and join us in prayer.
