Romans 5-8 Review & Reflection

Justified... and greatly loved by God! (5:1-11)

BUT... will my present sins and sufferings separate me from God's love?

- 1. No we can never ever 'out-sin' the overflowing grace of God! (5:12-21)
- 2. No we are one with Jesus in an unbreakable way! (6:1-14)
- 3. No we are no longer slaves to sin! (6:15-7:6)
- 4. No we are struggling with sin precisely because we're God's people! (7:7-25)
- 5. No we have God's life-giving Spirit helping us right now! (8:1-11)
- No we are God's sons forever, bound for His new world! (8:12-30)
- 7. No we will always belong to He who was separated from God for us! (8:31-39)

Raindrops Keep Falling on My Head

Matt 5:44 But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust.

It rained on the day I wrote this. Presumably the rain fell on the good and the bad. It seems God gives good gifts to people whether they worship Him or curse Him. Why would God do that?

If I were God, I would send rain only on the good, to those who deserve it. Good people would be given gifts, bad people would not be. That seems a fair way to allocate my generosity. And, it wouldn't apply only to gifts such as sun and rain. I would follow this principle through to things such as talents and abilities. In this world of mine, the most talented musicians, the cleverest scientists, the best football players would all be Christians who live holy lives and exhibit selfless love. It would be a world of consistent fairness where the good are rewarded, and the bad are not.

But I am not God, and the world in which we live is not like that. Instead, our Father in heaven pours out His goodness and His gifts indiscriminately, whether people acknowledge Him or not. Some might say God is wasteful, prodigal, in doing so.

But maybe it's not such a bad thing that God is prodigal, and He doesn't give people what they deserve. As we've been learning through our sermons in Romans, all of us "have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom 3:23); and "The wages of sin is death" (Rom 6:23). Where would we all be, if we sinners got what we deserved?

Christian thinkers from the past have used the term "common grace" to describe the fact that God sends gifts such as sunrise and rainfall to good and bad people. Common grace is a sign pointing to God. Do you find it hard to wrap your head around God's grace, God's unmerited favour towards humanity? Well, look out the window when it rains. Or maybe let the raindrops fall on your head.

The pitter patter is telling you that no matter how wicked and rebellious we are, our Father in heaven will continue to soak us with grace like rain. There are no tiny rain clouds that only float over, and rain on, people who have acquired enough goodness to deserve the rain. God pours out His grace indiscriminately over all people, even on sinners. Even on us.

Romans 5:8 but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
