BPCIS UPDATE

THE POWER OF STORY

I once heard a speaker from Disney who shared about a girl who left her teddy bear behind after visiting Disneyland. Her parents wrote to ask if it could be found and returned. Disney not only returned the bear but sent with it a story titled, "My Adventures at Disneyland" told firsthand by the lost bear. I was fascinated by the creativity behind what could have been a simple administrative procedure.

TRUE STORIES

If made-up stories like the one by the left-behind bear could appeal, how much more true stories! We have been telling such stories (or testimonies) on our BPCIS website. Two latest stories come from Mount Carmel BPC, one by someone who failed in school, suffered deep inferiority complex, and found her identity and worth. Another is by a caregiver who journeyed with her stroke-incapacitated sister for over 20 years.

In the coming months, we plan to feature such life stories, church by church. We will also hear from our pastors what they share as reflections with their churches. Remember to log in to bpcis.org.sg.

STORY OF BPCIS

As we celebrate our 15th Anniversary in 2026, we will put together a video, "The Story of BPCIS" from the time it was launched in 2011. More than 20 years after the BP denomination was disbanded in 1988 (with the Dissolution of the BP Synod), 11 BP churches have regathered to support one another in fellowship and service. Mark Saturday, 19 September 2026, for the Thanksgiving Dinner.

THE GREATEST STORY

All stories converge on the greatest Story ever told: the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Next year, our Good Friday services will be decentralised to 3 locations: churches in the West at Mount Carmel BPC, Central at Zion Bishan BPC, East at Shalom BPC. The Chinese service will be centralised at Zion Serangoon ZPC. Our Easter Sunrise Service will be at MacRitchie Reservoir. More details in due time.

Finally, remember us in prayer as we convene our Annual Presbytery Meeting on Saturday, 20 September, to elect new office-holders, and listen to guest speaker Rev Lee Hann Yang of Evangel BPC on the topic: "Mandarin Ministry: Sunset or Sunrise?" Appropriately, the venue is the newly acquired worship place of our Chinese-speaking church, Mount Gerizim BPC, at Woodlands 11.

WOZ Hanoi Fellowship Retreat 2025, 13 - 19 Aug: Hanoi, Ha Long Bay, Sa Pa, Fansipan, Vietnam

This trip was organized by WOZ and led by Pastor Lawrence Ong and his wife Linh, Chief Organiser cum Tour Leader. There were about 40 of us in all.





Apart from the celebration of faith, fellowship, food and fun, there were life lessons for us too!

<u>Life Lesson Number 1 – God Answers Prayer</u>

Nestled in a remote mountain village between Hanoi and Sa Pa, the nameless 'Sa Pa' Church became a hive of activity when we set to work in our various groups.

Reaching there required time and patience. After a six-hour bus ride from Hanoi to Sa Pa, we had to swop the comfort of the bus ride for a hair-raising or perhaps to some an exhilarating experience of riding pillion on motorbikes which understandably had to race up the long winding road. All this while, God kept us safe as the riders negotiated the bends skillfully.

Visiting this church was the highlight of the trip for many of us and we went prepared with medical supplies, art materials, food and offerings for the Hmong villagers. The adults were engaged with health screening and stretching exercises while the children sang and donned animal masks as they played their part in the storytelling of Noah's Ark. They also painted with spare art materials mistakenly stashed away from the main box which did not arrive. Despite the language barrier, communicating with the villagers was made possible with a few but capable Vietnamese (including the Tour Leader's two nephews) and Hmong interpreters.

God answers prayers and He did ours. He had blessed us with clement weather when rain had been forecast for the entire trip. He had provided and blessed us with the right people for the right job as we seemed to be in our element. It had been a fruitful interaction with the villagers despite hiccups. Not only were the villagers blessed with our visit, but we were also just as blessed, if not more so, with joy and a sense of purpose and fulfilment in serving them. All glory be to God!

<u>Life Lesson Number 2 – God's Soveriegnty and Protection</u>

A spectacular display of God's might rendered itself while we were sleeping on board the Aqua Elegance cruise ship at Ha Long Bay.

About two in the morning, there was a light and sound show, performed by none other than the Almighty Himself. Those who were awakened witnessed what Jesus' disciples did when they were caught in a thunderstorm in a boat. The show – fearsome streaks of lightning across the dark sky and the menacing rumbling of thunder that followed, the choppy sea with one huge wave ferociously and incessantly chasing one after another and the finale: water seeping into a few rooms beneath closed floor-to-ceiling windows – brought some of us to our knees in fervent beseech of the Lord for mercy. How insignificant and helpless we were in a situation like this! There was absolutely nothing that we could do but to submit ourselves to the Lord and trust His sovereignty. However, when it was time for our boating activity later in the morning, God graciously blessed us with a sprinkle.

May the Lord bless Vietnam and its beautiful people and land. And may the Lord strengthen our walk with Him after this trip.
