"I believe God is aware of our seasons of life, and I'm thankful he doesn't give us a family devotions model that's overly formal." - Jared Kennedy on TGC

A suggested simple template for families with children of any age:

1) Pray. Thank God for His Word that gives us instruction and helps us know Him better.

2) Read a passage from the Bible - If it's the OT, it can be one scene in a narrative. If it's NT one parable/incident that is happening. If it's an epistle/letter/Psalm or a Proverb can be a few verses.Or a story from a children's Bible (for 3 and under)Or the material for the day if you use a devotional.

3) Explain what the passage means / what's happening if you can. If you can't that's fine too!

A good guideline for parents to think about the passage would be to ask what the passage tells us about who God is, what He is doing in the passage, how did the people in the passage respond (if any) and how we should respond/how should it affect our hearts and our lives/does it help us to worship God and love Jesus more.

4) Close with a prayer. If possible in relation to what was read. Encourage children to pray as well. Even young children can follow the simple template of praying for 1 thing. It could be a Please God/Thank You God/ I'm sorry God prayer.

You can also refer to the church bulletin for some prayer points.




